

Physical Therapist Programs at SMU

Samuel Merritt University has one degree program leading to the Physical Therapist (PT) licensure: the Entry-Level Doctor of Physical Therapy (DPT) program. SMU's DPT program is accredited by the Commission on Accreditation in Physical Therapy Education (CAPTE). Graduates of Samuel Merritt University's DPT program are eligible to sit for the National Physical Therapy Examination (NPTE) certification exam in all US states, territories, and commonwealths, with the exceptions noted below. However, PT licenses are granted by the licensing authority in individual states and certain licensing boards may require applicants to taking a jurisprudence exam, a jurisprudence assessment module, and/or have other licensing requirements specific to that state. Prior to enrollment, prospective students must review the information below.

The <u>Physical Therapy Board of California</u> is the licensing authority for Physical Therapists in California and requires passing the NPTE as well as successful completion of the <u>California Jurisprudence</u>

<u>Assessment Module (CAL-JAM)</u> for licensure. Samuel Merritt University will assist applicants and students as they determine licensure requirements in other states.
